




Jazz is a funny, beautiful, loving, very good-natured girl whom we just adore. She lives with her sister Lacey, a border collie rescue, and us, her Mom and Dad. She is a very important member of our family and we wouldn't trade her for anything.

WE RESCUED SASHA (FORMERLY "MOMO") IN NOVEMBER 2010, when we pulled her from a kill shelter in Pensacola, Florida that does not work with rescue groups. Dee Wingfield sent us a note about Sasha. I was not familiar with the name "Momo," so searched for the meaning and discovered it means dummy. As the name indicated, she had been neglected and abused. Nevertheless, when we met her at the shelter, she was thrilled to receive positive attention and affection.

Sasha had many urgent medical needs to address. She was exhausted, underweight, unwilling to eat, losing fur, chronically infested with fleas and worms and had black skin disease or lichenitis over fifty percent of her body, as well as a severe UTI. She is allergic, it turned out, to fleas and many other things, too. Today her skin is pink and much healthier, however, the lichenitis damaged her hair follicles and she has alopecia leaving fur on only thirty-five to forty percent of her body. She has also been diagnosed with and treated for many other medical conditions, including low thyroid, Cushings disease, and diabetes.

Despite all of this, Sasha has blossomed into the sweetest little girl. She is very low key generally, except at breakfast and dinner times when she does a little happy dance before she gets her food. She is so delighted to this day when she receives unexpected one-on-one attention from us and reacts as though it's a wonderful surprise. She has, unexpectedly, become a bit of a diva and loves playing the princess in her Halloween costume.

Sasha Rosa lives in Virginia with Tom and Beth Rosa, as well as her siblings Max, a Norwegian Elkhound, age fourteen, and Kota, a Keeshond, age ten. Special thanks to KSRF for helping with some of Sasha's initial medical treatment costs!

TEEKA WAS A VERY SCARED, SKITTISH GIRL WHEN WE RESCUED HER from an Evansville shelter in May, 2006, at the age of two. Her previous owner claimed that Teeka did not get along with the other dog in the house. When we arrived home, we let her outside to explore the fenced backyard, but could not convince her to come inside. When we finally did, she did not want to go back out. So, we spent months carrying her in and out, trying to convince her that the big, scary backyard was a safe place for her to be.

She soon discovered that she could take refuge under our bed, but in order to get there, she had to "army crawl." This behavior earned her the nickname "Sneaky Snake". Stopping this behavior forced her to spend time with us, as well as her furry family. It was a turning point, as she began to play with a toy from time to time, and with some of her canine siblings. She also started going outside on her own, which meant she was finally housebroken.

Once we felt that Teeka was ready to go to a permanent home, we realized she was already there. She is a sweet, unassuming girl who has come out of her shell. She and her Dad finished a beginner obedience class and Teeka was named the "most improved student!" She went from having to be carried into the training building to walking in willingly and greeting her instructors.

Teeka loves to be petted and to have her belly rubbed. Although she is afraid of thunderstorms and fireworks, she seems generally happy and is a pretty good watchdog to boot. She can jump like a deer, effortlessly bounding over the 4-foot-high gate that separates our den from the hallway. For the most part, she is a docile girl, but she will stand her ground with the other dogs when necessary. Whatever the reason for her surrender, we are happy she is a part of our pack.

Stryder and Storm are mellow, well-behaved and loving Keeshonden. I am very fortunate that both were able to join my family.



HAVING GROWN UP WITH AN ENGLISH MASTIFF, I don't think of Buddy Guy as a big dog; however, at sixty pounds, he towers over the other Keeshonden at BARK events. Buddy Guy is definitely a gentle giant. He has been a patient, if begrudging, chew toy to the two foster Keesie puppies who have shared our home. He backs up when the four-pound, toothless bunny tries to eat his kibble and he likes to relax with the blind kitty in the back yard.

Buddy was surrendered to a kill-shelter with an excuse that his owner was too ill to care for him. However, I suspect it was Buddy Guy's own illness—epilepsy—that caused him to be dumped. When Buddy first came to live with me in September, 2011, he was taking phenobarbital and zonisamide and was having a seizure about once a month. However, in the days leading up to the new year, Buddy was having seizures several times a day. After a brief hospital stay, Buddy was stabilized and put on a new medication—Keppra.

Luckily, with Keppra, Buddy has been seizure-free ever since. Additionally, he was able to come off the rest of his medications, which has allowed his true Keeshond spirit to come through. While he is still gentle and patient, he now "tiggers" around the living room when it comes time to eat or go for a walk. And he has even started to initiate play with his new little Keesie brother Rocky.

Buddy is always by my side when I need him, nudging my arm and trying to climb in my lap when I am stressed out. I will never be able to give back all of the love and joy he brings to me, especially his introducing me to the warm fuzzy world of the Keeshond.



PATRICK'S STORY STARTS IN 2008, WHEN HE AND HIS BROTHER PETEY WERE SURRENDERED TO RESCUE after the shelter told his backyard breeder they were full. He and Petey had been kept in a basement, chained to the wall. I took both into rescue. I was told they were the littermates of my two rescues, Briscoe and Logan (they turned out to be half brothers).

After neutering and proper vetting, Petey moved to another foster home. However, Patrick had some behavior issues and stayed behind. He was adopted to a home in Maryland, which was not a success. This adopter dumped Patrick in a kill shelter and gave me less than five hours to save his life, as she had signed papers to have him euthanized!

My friend Steve, who has helped in transport and fostering for many years, offered to help. We dropped everything, drove to Maryland and rescued Patrick again from the shelter.

Patrick was then transferred to someone in New York who, we were told, had great success in behavior modification. After many months in this temporary foster situation, we found out through dumb luck the foster person had listed Patrick as "free to good home" on Craigslist! This could have been a disaster considering Patrick's behavior issues.

Again, Steve and I dropped everything and drove to New York in a snow and ice storm to get Patrick back before he was gone forever. With the help of the Sheriff's Department, we were able to safely retrieve Patrick and bring him home. So far, we'd logged over 1,200 miles on the road to save Patrick.

Steve offered to help with Patrick, as I had no available space. Patrick was diagnosed with behavioral seizures and put on phenobarbital. His transformation was a miracle! Not only is he a most handsome boy, he is now a calm, happy, bouncy Kees!

Steve eventually moved to Florida, taking Patrick another 1,200 miles! Now Patrick is enjoying palm trees, water views, and the life he so richly deserves. Patrick's journey is now complete – three rescues and 2,400 miles later – he is worth every mile!

Rescuer of the Year!

SHARON MILLER

HAS BEEN QUIETLY RESCUING KEESHONDEN FOR 27 YEARS!

SHE WAS INTRODUCED TO FOSTERING BY A KEES NAMED TEDDY IN 1987. When they got home from the shelter, Sharon discovered that his back was one giant hot spot full of maggots. She took him straight to the vet. The vet didn't think he'd make it, but Sharon and her son went back and visited him the next day, and that gave him the will to live. When she picked him up the next afternoon, the staff wanted to know what they had done to him – after they had left, he talked to everyone who walked by his kennel! All Teddy needed was someone who cared!

Sharon gave him an antibiotic bath every day for the first two weeks. He was placed in a nursing home. A year later, when the nursing home closed down, Sharon went with her contract in hand and said, "He's coming with me!" She placed him with a single lady who doted on him for the rest of his life.

What an introduction to rescue! To this day, Teddy is a poster boy for Peak to Peak Keeshond Rescue.

Sharon joined Peak to Peak Keeshond Fan- ciers in June, 1986,

nine months after it was founded. PPKF was originally an all-purpose club. They've had the same people on the rescue committee since 1989. In 1996, after the show side of the club had been inactive for seven years, they applied to the IRS to convert the club to a 501(C)3 organization, so donations are tax deductible. Dealing with the IRS is an adventure, but after eleven-months, their application was granted.

PPKF is the second oldest organized dog rescue in the Denver area. In the early '90s, they held two educational

seminars on how to get started in rescue, what to expect, and how to avoid rescue pitfalls. These seminars sparked the formation of All Breed Res- cue Network of the Denver Metro area.

PPKF was the first rescue group to have a booth at the Keeshond Na- tional Specialty in 1993. People loved what they had to offer! They paved the way for other rescue groups to have booths at a National.

"HOW CAN I LEAVE THEM TO DIE?"

Over the years, Sharon has seen rescue change.

In 1990, PPKF

placed 40 Kees in forever homes. Now they place 10-15 dogs per year. Life has become saner, but they're always looking for volunteers!

Sharon has personally fostered at least 40 Kees. When someone asks how she can stand to give them up, she replies, "How can I leave them to die?" She's very proud of the work PPKF has done over the past twenty-nine years. They've made a difference in the lives of a lot of Keeshonden! Isn't that what rescue is all about?

WHEN ROSIE WAS ABOUT FIVE YEARS OLD, HER SPECIAL PERSON PASSED AWAY and his widow was unable to care for Rosie, so she surrendered her to SCKR. Rosie was welcomed to a loving foster home where she was groomed, checked by a veterinarian, brought up to date on all her shots and evaluated for placement with an adoptive home. A retired couple adopted Rosie in mid-2011, about the same time we adopted Teddy from SCKR.

Two years later, Rosie's adoptive parents returned her to SCKR, stating she had bladder stones and they could not manage the expense of her required surgery and special diet. Rosie went back to the same foster home and SCKR paid for her surgery. Rosie needs a special diet and testing every six months for the rest of her life.

Despite advertising Rosie as available for a special needs adoption, a suitable adoptive home was not found. As volunteers for SCKR, we met Rosie at the Annual Picnic in November, 2013, and just couldn't get her out of our minds. We had the feeling that she was going to be a permanent foster, as most people wanted younger dogs without special needs. In March, 2014, we called SCKR and asked to adopt Rosie. We don't really know why; we just felt a special connection with her.

We picked Rosie up in April, 2014. She loves her foster Mom, but we think she knew she was going to her forever home as she immediately jumped in the back seat of our car. She made herself right at home, even giving Teddy and Harley a little growl when they rushed her. She is house-trained, giving us a little whimper to go out.

Rosie was accustomed to eating breakfast at 4 am. Her first morning here, she put her front paws on the bed and whimpered at 4 am, not a time we like to be up! After 3 months, she woke us up at 5 a.m. We're shooting for 6 am. She learned in three days that 7 pm is treat time. She likes to shred silk flowers, so all of them have been elevated.

Rosie is one of the most adaptable dogs we have ever seen. She is so very easy to love. We are so happy we decided to make this delightful little lady a permanent part of our family.

They were either born with or developed a kneecap deformity, patellar luxation, which left them only able to drag their rear legs. They were apparently subject to incremental abuse due to this condition.

Shack (and Moose) were rescued in February, 2013, by Hearts United, a rescue foundation. Hearts United raised donations that enabled successful surgery on both of them, allowing them full mobility.

Shack's recovery has been one of life's special experiences. He is so incredibly brave and resilient. His anxiety decreases every day and he is well on his way to normal. He has the biggest heart. It's like he's trying to squeeze extra love in every moment to make up for those he lost. The first thing I do when I wake, and the last thing I do before I sleep, is pet this special soul curled up against me.
